

Rosalie, Wash. Oct 4, 1937.

The Town Council of the Town of Rosalie met in special session on this date, as per requirements of the State Law, for the purpose of hearing any tax payer in favor or against the proposed expenditures of public funds, as set forth in the annual budget.

Present: Mayor J. Higgs, Councilmen Brown, Sweden, Helmer, Blackman and Ogden.

No objections were made to the Budget as advertised, by the taxpayers, and it was moved and seconded that the Budget for the year 1938 be accepted, and that the sum of \$3305⁰⁰ be made the amount to be raised by direct taxation of the property within the Town, the vote being unanimous, the Budget was declared legally adopted by the Mayor.

Total Expenses	\$5900 ⁰⁰
Total Receipts	2595 ⁰⁰
Total to be raised by tax	3305 ⁰⁰

This was also the date set by the Town Council to have the legal voters of the Town of Rosalie vote in favor of or against the levying of an additional 7 mill tax for the purpose of purchasing fire fighting equipment.

The Mayor appointed Councilmen Blackman, Helmer and Ogden to canvass the votes cast and they reported as follows:

For Bonds or Warrants	107
Against " " "	4
For Levy	101
Against " "	6

The majority of the votes being cast in favor of purchasing fire fighting equipment, the Mayor declared the election legally carried and adopted.
