A word from City Hall

A new year is upon us, and we at City Hall are immensely proud to be an active part of what makes this beautiful community thrive. With this newsletter, we aim to keep residents informed about what is happening in 2025.

Recent highlights

In January, the Public Works Department plowed, salted, and sanded the roads. They cleared the snow berm off Whitman Avenue, as well as hauled and stocked the salt shed. The team repaired the plows as needed and serviced the equipment and trucks. Additionally, they replaced a fire hydrant and repaired a water leak on Josephine.

In February, flooding backed up the lift station (sewage system). The Public Works Department ensured that there was no overflow or environmental contamination. The pumps at the lift station are often blocked by items that should not be flushed. Please do **NOT** flush baby wipes, "flushable" wipes, clothing, towels, underwear, or toys. You would be surprised at what our team has to remove by hand from the pumps. Gravel has been delivered to repair damage from washouts. All of this in addition to their day-to-day responsibilities.
