

Town of Rosalia Safe Evacuation Routes



Who can I call to notify of a gas leak? If you suspect a gas leak, immediately evacuate the area, avoid sparks in the area, and call for help (911 and then AVISTA at 800-227-9187). Do not repair or restrict the gas flow. Stay away from the area until emergency personnel indicate it's safe to return.

Where to go if...?

If you are north of 1st Street go north. If you are south of 1st Street go south.

In the event of an emergency please look for and follow the information provided by local authorities. Information will be provided over the Radio and News and the City's Website

How do I avoid causing a gas leak?

Always call before you dig!
To comply with Washington's Dig Law, RCW 19.122, and begin the locating and marking process, call 811 or visit callbeforeyoudig.org at least two business days before you dig (excluding Saturday, Sunday, and legal holidays).ⁱ

What is a safe

evacuation route?

A safe evacuation route is a designated path that is free of hazards, well marked, and designed to move people away from an emergency to a safe location or meeting point. **In the event of an emergency please look for and follow the information provided by local authorities**

Why is Rosalia developing this now?

The City of Rosalia received grant funding from United State Department of Transportation Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration Technical Assistance Grant with the goal to:

- Improve Graphic Information Service (GIS) mapping related to high-hazard pipelines in and near the town.
- Increase public engagement related to high-hazard pipelines in and near the town.
