CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 PM

APPROVAL OF MINUTES, CLAIMS AND PAYROLL

Eric Eilertson moved to approve the January 27, 2026 minutes and transactions number 174 through 238 totaling \$148,855.77. **John Berggren** seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

GUESTS

Julie Price, Rosalia School Superintendent and Reesa Duncan, District Business Manager were in attendance to report on the district and review the replacement levies on the ballot. Among the items mentioned were grants received for ADA renovations and HVAC updating. There is another grant pending for kitchen remodel project. Superintendent Price indicated that the district is fiscally sound but on a tight budget due to a decline in enrollment.

Mayor Goyke mentioned that the city would be contacting the District to discuss payment for water used on the softball field.

PUBLIC WORKS

Mayor Goyke reported that Jacob Billington had submitted a grant proposal to RTPO. He is currently training for spray certification. He has also been in contact with JUB regarding the TIB project for 7th and 8th. JUB suggested the town work with Spokane County on engineering projects. GS mapping project is complete.

AIRPORT

Ryan Diamond reported they are awaiting FAA approval.

ADVERTISEMENT FOR NEW ATTORNEY

Mayor Goyke was authorized by consensus to advertise for a new city attorney. The council is seeking more active assistance for code enforcement.

LIBRARY

K. Hughes with the Whitman County Library has informed the town received a matching grant from Commerce Department Grant for \$72,000 to be spent before 2027. The town will call for bids. The matching portion will be satisfied by the town providing the building.

RV PARK

Jake will start work when weather permits. It was suggested that the water lines be blown out and work begun as soon as possible with weather and daily work schedules permitting. The Port of Whitman will be assisting with the costs of the renovation project. It was also noted that the town needs a stand alone air compressor. The Port of Whitman will reimburse the town for the amount of the grant.

PORT OF WHITMAN GRANT POSSIBILITIES



ORDINANCE UPDATE


It was requested that Tina Coe provide the Council with written updates and that updating the nuisance ordinance be completed.
