Regular Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: 7:31pm

Approval of Minutes, Claims, and Payroll:

Ryan Diamond moved to approve Dec 9th, 2025, meeting minutes and transactions #1693 totaling \$5,314.50 and transactions #1739-#1881 totaling \$73,124.34 and transactions #2-#70 totaling \$7,315.31. **Judith Littleton** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Streets- The snowplow blade is in need of servicing. Goyke or the Public Works Department will obtain cost estimates. The Mayor also requested that the town explore the potential purchase of a street sweeper.

Water- Sampler was purchased.

Library: The status of the library grant will continue to be monitored

Rv Park- The Town will move forward with the application process for the 0.09 funds

Park & Pool- Coordinate with the school district to set up a discussion regarding the ballpark utility bill. In the spring, separate utility meters will be installed for the pool and park restrooms

Valorie Bryan motions to amend the 2026 budget to move \$5,000 from current expense fund into the park fund. Ryan Diamond seconded and motion passed unanimously

Community Center **Youth Littleton** motions to approve the school to use the community center for cheerleading practices. **Ryan Diamond** seconds and motion passes unanimously.

City Hall- Replace windows.

Website- Updated.


Miscellaneous- The Council postponed the appointment of a new Mayor Pro Tem until all Council members are in attendance and confirmation is received that all newly elected and re-elected Council members have been duly sworn in. Mayor Goyke also stated that he would like to purchase two time clocks—one for City Hall and one for the City Shop.

Code Enforcement- The Council discussed adding the word “**nuisance**” to the code concerning abandoned buildings. They also considered reaching out to renters to determine if they would be willing to work with Community Action to explore additional options for cleaning up of the property.


Council members also discussed residents burning materials that are not allowed, as well as content for the upcoming newsletter. Additionally, the Council reviewed AWC class opportunities.
