Regular Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: 7:30pm

Roll Call: Mayor John Goyke, John Berggren, Judith Littleton, Val Bryan, Eric Eilertson

Unexcused absence: Ryan Diamond

Approval of Minutes, Claims, and Payroll:

Eric Eilertson moved to approve January 13th, 2026, meeting minutes and transactions # 104-#164 totaling \$17,127.18. **Val Bryan seconded** the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor's Report: A meeting was held with the Port of Whitman regarding possible funding for a new roof for the Community Center and new windows for City Hall. John G. stated that he will look into obtaining quotes for the projects. The council reached a consensus that they do not wish to spend funds to remain a member of SEWDA. Everyone on council is sworn in.

Council comments: The council reached a consensus to proceed with the Spokane County interlocal agreement, noting that the version presented was a rough draft.

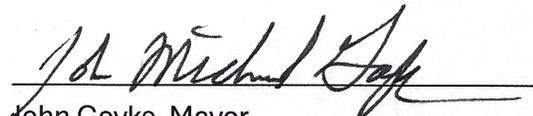
Code Enforcement: Looking into our ordinances and contacting other towns.

Miscellaneous: Regarding the selection of a new Town Attorney, the council agreed to advertise the position in *The Spokesman* and the *Whitman County Gazette*, and staff will look further into the town attorney contract. Concerning American Tower, the council expressed a desire to keep the lease as it currently stands. It was also noted that the recycle bin is owned by the county and was originally intended to be shared between Pine City, Malden, and Rosalia; the county may consider relocating the recycle bin to a more central location between the three towns.

Mayor Pro Tem: Judy Littleton nominated Eric Eilertson for Mayor Pro Tem, and John Berggren seconded the nomination. John Berggren then nominated Val Bryan for Mayor Pro Tem, and Eric Eilertson seconded the nomination. Nominations were closed, and a written, concealed ballot was conducted. The ballot results were three votes for Val Bryan and one vote for Eric Eilertson. Val Bryan was declared the new Mayor Pro Tem.

Judith Littleton moved to adjourn. Eric Eilertson seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.
