Regular Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: 7:30pm

Roll Call: Mayor John Goyke, John Berggren, Judith Littleton, Val Bryan, Ryan Diamond, Eric Eilertson

Approval of Minutes, Claims, and Payroll:

Eric Eilertson moved to approve March 24th, 2026, meeting minutes and transactions #483-#517 totaling \$25,217.05. **Judith Littleton seconded** the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Guests: Joe Griffen, Ryan Bothman, Rachel Evans, Angie Trevino, Pat Voge, Mary Helms, Jacob Billington.

Rachel Evan described a violent dog attack that occurred on April 4, 2026, involving her family. She explained that her dog was attacked while her nieces and nephews were present, creating a chaotic and frightening situation. She emphasized the emotional trauma experienced by everyone who witnessed the incident, as well as the ongoing physical injuries—particularly to her mother, Angie, and her dog, Spike. Rachel stressed that the issue is not a lack of rules, but rather a lack of enforcement of existing ordinances. She concluded by urging stronger enforcement measures to prevent similar incidents, highlighting the lasting psychological and physical impact on her family.

Joe Griffen raised concerns about ongoing issues with loose dogs in multiple areas around town, noting that leash ordinances have been loosely enforced. He also reported concerns about several properties and homes that appear dilapidated and may require code enforcement action.

The council confirmed the town is working with a new lawyer to move things forward, and the old contract with the previous attorney will be resent.

Eric Eilertson motions to approve the new attorney contract **Ryan Diamond** Seconded motioned passed unanimously.

Streets: Jacob Billington provided an update to the council on current activities within the Rosalia Public Works Department. April meter readings have been completed. Work at the RV park is ongoing, with crews currently waiting on crushed asphalt. The TIB

project has officially started, and street and sidewalk cleanup efforts are underway. Street signs have been ordered and installed, and road grading has been completed. Equipment maintenance includes servicing mowers, and ongoing efforts include pothole repairs and replacing parts in the well house. Storm line work outside the scope of the TIB project is also in progress. Additionally, Jacob has been researching grant opportunities, joined the RTPO, and has been attending classes to obtain necessary certifications.

Eric Eilertson Moved to buy and install stop sign for 9th and Josphine **John Berggren** second and motion passed unanimously.

Council would like a Fall Dumpster for fall clean up days in September or October


IT computers handed out will have ones picked out next meeting.
