Regular Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: 7:30pm

Roll Call: Mayor John Goyke, John Berggren, Judith Littleton, Val Bryan, Ryan Diamond, Eric Eilertson

Approval of Minutes, Claims, and Payroll:

Eric Eilertson moved to approve April 14th, 2026, meeting minutes and transactions #557-#645 totaling \$31,704.66. **John Berggren** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Guests: **Lisa Kuehne and Sherry Hames** would like for them to be an interlocal agreement between the park board and city hall allowing handle pool payroll. Mayor suggested they come up with interlocal agreement and present it to council and new attorney.

Val Bryan motioned to approve the battle days committee to use town dumpster **John Berggren** seconded and motioned passed

Val Bryan motioned to approve the street closure for the Rosalia battles days from 1st to 9th and then moved to 5th and 7th for June 6th, 2026, **John Berggren** seconded and motioned pass unanimously

Val Bryan motioned to approve the Rosalia battle days committee to use the detour signs and be in charge of them setting out and putting them away. **Eric Eilertson** seconds and motion passes unanimously.

Hannah Kimball introduced herself to the council and described her background.

Casey Lowder – pine creek conservation district who's in charge of soil heath, water and wildfire safety with homeowners and have resources and showed interlocal agreement for woodchipper usage for council to read and view.

John and Della Wisdom: discussed problem with dirt bike riding, safety concerns and noise complaints about it as well as the private property owner's liability and who's liability is it if child gets hurt.

Paul Bucholtz: discussed the dirt bikes and motorcycles' safety concerns speeding around the corners and not wearing helmets. Riding all day long the noise is unbearable.

Streets: Mosquito spraying starts in May

John Berrgern motioned to approve to turn Reiger and 7th from pavement to dirt road and to oil it with Jeskes. **Judith Littleton** seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Water: chlorine pump bought for \$1,800 cheaper than normal \$3,000 and was installed April 28th, 2026

Sewer:

Airport: waiting for lease approvals

Code Enforcement: New town attorney – and talked about old town attorney removal process and how all records from them will take month to get back.

Library: need to set up time to talk about grant-to-grant people

RV Park: \$750 prepaid monthly costs for construction workers and or contractors to rv park rules and Rv park is open for use

Park & Pool: parcel numbers and legal descriptions were sent to title company and waiting on response.

Community Center: **Daine Totten (Guest)**: talked about using the community center for OSDI breakfast and lunch for summer food program and council by con census agreed to community center fee.

City Hall: Windows and roofing bids – need to contact Port of Whitman

Website & Reader: Both Updated

Miscellaneous: **Val Bryan** motioned to approve ordinance number 614 transfer the sum of \$5,000 from current expense fund no.001 to park fund no. 102 **Judith Littleton** seconded and motion passed unanimously.

Courtney Taylor reported that her dog is currently back at home in her care after previously staying on a farm outside city limits. Hannah Kimball explained that complaints had been submitted and that the purpose of the meeting was to allow Taylor to present information before the council determines whether the dog is dangerous, potentially dangerous, or not dangerous, with a decision possibly coming later in the week and to be delivered in writing, along with an option to appeal. Taylor stated she was not present during the incident, that the injuries did not require stitches, and

described the dog as non-aggressive, noting it is currently nursing kittens and has only gotten loose three times in two years. She also suggested there may be similar-looking dogs, claimed the interaction with Angie Trevino's dog was playful, and said her dog is an emotional support animal for her son, is up to date on vaccinations, and will leave with another son in June. Although she offered for the council to meet the dog, the meeting was limited to hearing her account. During deliberations, council members discussed whether the dog had any history of attacks, noted they wanted to review a police report that was not available at the time, and considered potential liability issues before continuing their discussion.

Eric Eilertson motioned to deem Courtney Taylor's dog potentially dangerous. **Val Bryan seconded** motion passed unanimously.

A letter will be sent to notify Courtney Taylor of their decision, after which she will have time to appeal and may return to speak with the council again; in the meantime, the dog must be removed from city limits.

Micheal Baumgarten will be having meeting at City Hall May 8th, 2026, politician


Judith Littleton motioned to approve the chipper interlocal agreement unless the insurance has issues. **Val Bryan** seconded and motion passed unanimously.
