CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 PM

APPROVAL OF MINUTES, CLAIMS AND PAYROLL

Eric Eilertson moved to approve the July 28, 2026, minutes and transactions 1075 through 1168 totaling \$82,649.36. **Val Bryan** seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

PUBLIC WORKS—WATER

Water was recently shut off on north end of town to repair a pump valve that was allowing pumped water to return to the well. There is also another major repair/replacement on a water line that will require a future shut off of water service on 8th between Brockway and Park Street.

PARK AND RECREATION LEVY RESULTS

On the initial vote count, the levy appears to have passed. However, there is a further process to verify the results before the results can be certified.

RV PARK

It is open for use with some spaces filled. There is still some work to be done to complete the project.

CODE ENFORCEMENT ORDINANCE REPORT

The town's attorney should have the highest priority ordinance revisions ready for review at the next council meeting. The town needs to comply with regulation for a Cross Connection Control Specialist requirement which needs to be included in Ordinances.

LIBRARY

The library system was shut down last week for annual cleaning. Mayor Goyke met with library staff working on the grants for local library upgrades.

PARK AND POOL

Research is continuing to confirm actual legal ownership. There are some questions about the ballpark and how the donation of land was handled.

MAYOR COMMENTS

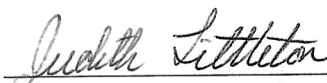
Mr. Goyke reported that he will be out of town for training and absent from the August 25th council meeting. He noted that he hoped to have the new ordinances available for council review prior to that meeting. He also noted that enforcement will rest with the Whitman County Sheriff, and some negotiation may be required after the scope of those ordinances is reviewed.

The recent Wells Road Fire that caused the town to be under level 2 evacuation order was reviewed. After a complete debriefing, the process for release of information and other matters will be further reviewed to be better prepared in the event of a similar situation in the future.
